RESILIENCY:

The capacity of individuals, communities, institutions, businesses, and systems within a region to plan, sustain, adapt, recover, improve and grow collaboratively –regardless what kind of chronic stresses and acute shocks they experience – through specific actions and implementation strategies geared to address specific vulnerabilities.

Local and regional governments and agencies are working to discuss and prepare for different aspects of resiliency from public education and outreach to analysis and policy development. Understanding the roles, responsibilities and opportunities for local jurisdictions and agencies in preparing and planning for and responding to disasters, climate adaption, and all things resiliency can be overwhelming. The East Central Florida Regional Planning Council was awarded a Department of Environmental Protection Grant to develop, through stakeholder engagement and input, a Regional Resiliency Action Plan to *“Increase the ability of local and regional stakeholders to implement resiliency and climate adaptation strategies across disciplines.”*

Collaborate with other local jurisdictions and agencies to discuss the roles, responsibilities, opportunities and barriers in addressing resiliency based on the following four parameters:

- *Leadership and Strategy*
- *Infrastructure and Environment*
- *Health and Wellbeing*
- *Economy and Society*

LISTENING SESSION GOALS

- Discuss barriers to implementation and identify solutions.
- Identify appropriate department and agencies roles and responsibilities to actionable items.
